Police and Safety Report

Cincinnati Fire Company 19

Did not attend meeting

CPD - District 4 - Sgt. Jeff Meister

- Uptick in burglaries, robberies, felonious assault over previous month, however these rates are down compared to last year.
- What is driving the crime rate right now is theft. Examples: Porch pirates, theft from Corryville Kroger.
- Nightly, from 10pm 3am, CPD has 3 police officers (2 officers and a supervisor in 3 cars) on overtime, driving around and dealing with hot spots in Corryville, mainly Short Vine. This goes on year-round, even when UC is out of session (UC pays for this.)
- A community concern about individuals loitering near Dominos/Stagerlee's was mentioned. Their suggestion was to have concerned residents call 765-1212 and police can deal with this.
- Safe Gun Storage Week CPD is giving out gun locks; visit any of the district headquarters to pick up a free gun lock. They are also available at the Corryville library.



Greg Valerius, UCPD

- UC is hosting a basketball tournament this summer July 20, 22, 24.
- UCPD is starting a new reporting system, but they don't anticipate any problems with issuing reports, etc.

New Business

2901 Glendora - Uptown Properties, represented by Patrice Eby Burke

- Proposing a new three story building to replace existing building. It will have 11 units, 36 beds.
- No parking associated with this housing, but paid parking is available directly across the street at another Uptown Property.
- Uptown is seeking two variances front yard variance and backyard variance.
- Vote on the variances Result: One abstention, other voters support the front and back variances.
- Uptown has not committed to constructing this building may end up selling the property to another developer.

Mural

- SVA will put \$500 toward it. Total cost \$13,000.

Pedestrian Safety

- We have two opportunities for funding for pedestrian safety.
- One near a school / park / recreation area (guaranteed funding)
- One 2025 major traffic calming program (competitive) ours will be speed cushions at the Jefferson / Nixon curve in the road.
- Reminder Quick build curb extensions are coming to Jefferson and Ruther in the next 60 days. Speed cushions already coming to Eden.
- Stop sign at Eden and Rochelle is not visible due to tree overhanging.
 There should be stop lines painted in the street.
- Slip lane into Burnet Woods from MLK feels unsafe this will be our request for the school / park / recreation area (Guaranteed).

Burnet Woods

Dog park came in over \$100k over initial estimates.
