Call to Order and Opening Comments

Police and Safety Report

CPD - Officer Sean Dent, CPD District 4

- Discussion of the issues with juveniles starting fights and drinking after hours at restaurants on Short Vine.
- Suggests that some restaurants on Short Vine don't have the amount of staffing there to have proper oversight of the liquor – young people can jump the counter and obtain the alcohol illegally.
- Suggests creating a seminar to be held in the Corryville area on senior Medicare fraud. One was held in Roselawn recently and was very well attended.

UCPD - Officer Valerius

- Had to leave early to attend to fight taking place at HS graduation on UC campus

Cincinnati Fire -

- Slow time of year with the students heading out for the summer

New Business

Corryville CDC – Fran Larkin (for Brandon Williams)

- Seeking a letter from CCC in support of their acquisition of former Mecklenburg Gardens property.
 - Inspection completed 4/30/25
 - Environmental Safety Assessment completed 5/6/25
 - Appraisal report is underway
 - CDC is working out to potential operators and co-developers.

Residents voted on writing the letter of support – 11 for, 0 against, 0 abstentions.



CCC Board Membership

- Nomination from the floor for Deborah to take the open seat available on the CCC board.
 - Fran Larkin will check the bylaws to confirm that there is an open seat available.
 - A vote was taken to confirm Deborah for the seat, should one be found open.
 - The vote was 10 for, 0 against, 1 abstention.

Old Business

NSP

- Proposal of community expenses that take advantage of the \$10,000 neighborhood support program funding distributed by the city.
- Items: Website Hosting and email service; Gateway Gardens in neighborhood; Uptown Waste Diversion; Corryville Promotional Materials; Extra neighborhood business district banners (Jefferson/Nixon); Pollinators project at Vine/W. Nixon; Rec. Center Support
- Voted – 11 voted for the NSP distribution, 0 against, 0 abstentions.

Burnet Woods – Rachel Wells

- Good Spring Fest this year.
- Through the month of May, Saturday 1 – 2 pm Nature Encounters at Trailside Nature Center.
- Wednesdays in the Woods begins May 28th, 7pm. Free community concerts at Bandstand during the summer.
- Veg Fest early in June
- Construction hasn't started yet on Dog Park.
- BPACC sent letter to the Parks Commission last month about Combined Sewer Overflows (CSO) in the park. Closures associated with the CSO affect a large part of the park.

CRC Report – Chase Brown, Youth Program Coordinator

- All 70 spots for summer camp are filled, with 15 children on the waiting list.
 - Scholarships available up to \$500 - \$700 per child. Need based. Kids have to qualify for free or reduced lunch, and should live within city limits.
 - Kids with disabilities or special needs can also enroll and they will be given a one-on-one assistant to be with them all the time they're at the camp.
- Have not had to tow anybody yet.
- Rachel Re working on getting the names and license plates of residents so that they won't be towed in the fall.
- Working on program for people 18+ to get more college students involved.
- Afterschool registration for childcare will start in July. Can take about 30 kids, it will fill up. Fairview, CANS, North Avondale Mont., Corryville Catholic can get picked up.
- CRC doesn't have any programming for individuals with disabilities, but LeBlonde Rec. Center near the river and Walnut Hills does have programming for them 7 days a week.



Library – Stefani Hicks

- Summer Reading program starts in two weeks. For children. If they do certain activities they can get a prize. They get a free book for signing up!
