Call to Order and Opening Comments

Police and Safety Report

CPD - Officer Sean Dent, CPD District 4

- Reports that spontaneous illegal “Twerk Party” parties are occurring at empty housing and park locations near UC and Xavier campuses. These are teenagers, not college students. Roving group of teens that have had street parties on Ludlow (in Clifton) recently and on Short Vine. There has been some violence in the groups that have been attracted to these parties. If you hear something or find out about something on social media, call the Police.

UCPD - Officer Valerius

- Move ins at UC are happening. Big days will be August 19, 20, 21. Heavy traffic congestion around campus. Fall semester starts the 25th.
- CUF is doing National Night Out September 24th, 6 – 9pm. More information in September about this.

Treasurer's Report

- General Fund numbers –
 - Landscaping fund has seen no change.
 - \$1,500 check from Parks Foundation for Spring Fest, International Children's Day and Fall Fest.
 - \$10,000 from NSP funding. \$1,000 was used for Uptown Waste Diversion.
 - The rest of NSP will be spent – Gateway Gardens, CCC website and emails, money for promoting Corryville at neighborhood events.

- Burnet & University – Sliplane Removal
 - Requests were both denied – City chose to fund projects in other neighborhoods

- Nature Encounters return on Saturdays in September
- International Children's Day on September 20 at 11am
- Dog park in Burnet Woods will be open soon.
- CSOs in Burnet Woods. Bob Highland, Ken Petren, and students at UC are working on project. MSD is doing a study in relation to the overflows.

Speed Bumps on Eden

- City installed speedbumps on Eden and asked the CCC what the neighborhood response is. Residents are generally approving of them as they slow down the traffic.
